1903 - 1992

Richard C. Fienning was born September 3, 1903, first child of George and Frances Fienning, Richmond, Indiana. His life in the Lutheran Church also began in 1903 when he was baptized. It was in 1917 with a class of twenty-three that he confirmed his baptismal vows. His confirmation verse reads, "This is eternal life: to know thee who alone art truly God, and Jesus Christ whom thou hast sent." John 17:3.

He was active in the life of Trinity as well as in the community. Richard owned and operated the Fienning Food Market for 57½ years. He was a 50 year member of the Richmond Lodge No. 196, F&AM and had served on the Board of Directors of Wayne Lakes at Greenville, Ohio.

Mr. Fienning is preceded in death by his first wife, Myrtle, and his second wife, Vera, a daughter, Janet, and one son, Earl.

Survivors: three daughters, Frances, Wanda and Betty; one son, Dan; 17 grandchildren; 18 great-grandchildren; and two great-great-grandchildren. Other survivors include three sisters, Edith, Ruth and Esther; three brothers, Edward, Robert and Rudolph; nieces and nephews.
